




Poppy is the prankster of this flock. She lives life in the fast lane and loves acting the fool to make the other birds laugh.

Dahlia is a science wizard who loves explosive experiments, creating new species of plants, and pushing herself to dream up the next amazing invention.


Gale is Stella's former best friend who now hops down a darker path, even though part of her just wants to reunite with her friends.






Handsome Pig is a devoted (and stylish) follower of Gale who will do anything to win her love and affection.




BLOGGING

A blog is a frequently updated online personal journal or diary that can focus on basically anything. Blogging is an inexpensive hobby that you can start independently. You can write about your personal life, or choose interesting topics and publish your observations on them.

If you're shy about writing as yourself, don't worry—you can easily create a blog anonymously, or by using an interesting alias. Numerous animals and imaginary characters also have their own blogs. While most of the blogs out there have mostly text content, there are also blogs based on sharing only videos, photos, or art.

DID YOU KNOW? One of the most famous diaries is that of Anne Frank. Anne Frank depicted her life in hiding during World War II through her personal diary, which has sold more than 25 million copies to date.





This artistic hobby is extremely popular, especially these days thanks to smartphones. Taking photos is very easy—even the clueless Minion Pigs could press the shutter at the right moment and take a bunch of silly selfies—presuming they would understand the meaning of a camera, of course!

However, capturing moments into multiple photos is a bit trickier. You need technical knowledge of your equipment and little bit of an artistic eye to determine when and where it's best to photograph. Don't fall into despair if your photos don't immediately look like the ones in a magazine—it takes years to become a professional photographer!

STELLA: THE OUTDOOR JIFE

Stella is a real adventure-seeker who enjoys the outdoors the most. She gets easily bored if there's not enough action in her day, and she enjoys spending time with her best bird friends.





Originating in France, parkour is an obstacle-passing sport where the participants aim to get from one specific place to another in the most efficient way possible. There's no need for special equipment, as parkourers only use their bodies and their surroundings for propulsion.

Parkour is usually practiced in urban landscapes, but can be adapted to any location. The sport often includes running, jumping, and vaulting, but can include climbing, crawling, and rolling; whatever is needed to move fluently without having to stop. Being able to see the environment in a new way is also an essential part of the sport.

Always remember: Start your athletic hobby in a safe and familiar environment!

DID YOU KNOW? Parkour became popular in the late 1990s, and has been featured in numerous movies and advertisements.



In this outdoor recreational activity, participants use a GPS receiver or mobile device to hide and seek "geocaches." A typical cache is a small waterproof container containing a logbook. The finder enters the date and signs it with their code name, then places the cache in same place where it was found.

DID YOU KNOW? Probably the trickiest geocache to achieve is located at the International Space Station. Space tourists left it there in 2008.

Caches are listed on the internet, and they can be found anywhere in urban and rural areas. Played for the first time in 2000, geocaching has since spread all around the world, with millions of caches found every day.



This action sport involves a board that is used for riding and performing tricks. Skateboarding was invented in California when surfers wanted to find something to do when the waves were too flat. Skateboarding quickly grew to become a competitive sport on its own, but many active skaters consider it a recreational activity first and foremost.

Skateboarders often use urban grounds as their setting, but many cities have specially designed skateparks. The only required instrument is the board, even though professional skateboarders usually have specially designed shoes and clothing for skating purposes!

DID YOU KNOW? It was illegal to import, possess, or ride a skateboard in Norway between 1977 and 1989. It was believed that skateboarding was a reckless pursuit, which endangered not only the skaters themselves, but also the elderly who walked the streets.



DAHLIA:

SCIENCE & KNOWLEDGE

Dahlia loves the sciences, and her hunger for knowledge often seems endless. She wants to understand how things work, and enjoys doing some explosive exciting experiments in her lab—sometimes even working through the night if she has a new theory to test!





Enjoy watching the sky at night? Then astronomy might be a happy fit for you. Amateur astronomers are usually not driven by scientific research, but instead they monitor planets, stars, meteor showers, and other phenomenon just for the fun of it.

Some night sky happenings can be spotted with your bare eye, and therefore the telescope is not compulsory equipment. If you live close to a space observatory, find out when they have public sessions.

DID YOU KNOW? The sun is 400 times larger than the moon, but is 400 times further away from Earth, making them both appear the same size.

EXPERIMENTS

Scientists inspect and perform experiments, and even if you're not a professional, you can conduct exciting observations of the world in your own home. A microscope is an excellent tool for a curious mind, but the home scientist's field isn't limited to just that.

Amateur chemistry can be done with common chemicals available in your home. Here's a little experiment you can do with basic kitchen equipment:

DAHLIA'S TRICK: RAINBOW IN A GLASS

What You Need:

- Sugar
- Water
- Food coloring
- Tablespoon
- 5 glasses
- · A transparent container



PREPARATIONS:

 Line up five glasses. Add 1 tablespoon of sugar to the first glass, 2 tablespoons to the second glass, 3 tablespoons to the third glass, and 4 tablespoons to the fourth glass. The fifth glass should remain empty.

2. Add 3 tablespoons of water to each of the first four glasses. Stir each solution. If the sugar does not dissolve in any of the four glasses, then add one more tablespoon of water to each of the four glasses.

3. Add 2-3 drops of red food coloring to the first glass, yellow to the second glass, green to the third glass, and blue to the fourth glass. Stir.

EXPERIMENT:

Fill the last glass about one-fourth full of the blue sugar solution. Carefully layer some green sugar solution above the blue liquid. Do this by putting a spoon in the glass, just above the blue layer, and pouring the green solution slowly over the back of the spoon. If you do this right, you won't disturb the blue solution much at all. Add green solution until the glass is about half full, then add yellow and red using the same method.



This practically free hobby develops your vocabulary and comprehension skills, and you can practice it almost anywhere. Even if you've had a bad experience with a book you didn't enjoy that much, definitely give reading a second chance.

Reading shouldn't feel boring; indeed, it should feel quite the opposite! By reading a lot you can learn new things and understand the actions of other people (both in fiction and the real world) in an entertaining way. It also develops your critical thinking, improves your writing skills, and reduces stress. Who doesn't love that?!

DID YOU KNOW? U.S. president George Washington once borrowed a book called *The Law of Nations* from the New York Society Library. He forgot to return it, but the library finally got it back—221 years later! Luckily, they didn't demand the late fees!

THREE GREAT INVENTIONS CREATED BY ACCIDENT

POTATO CHIPS: Chef George Crum reportedly created the potato chip in 1853 at Moon's Lake House near Saratoga Springs, New York. Fed up with a customer who continuously sent his fried potatoes back, complaining that they were soggy and not crunchy enough, Crum sliced the potatoes as thinly as possible, fried them in hot grease, and salted them. The customer loved them, and the rest is history.


PENICILIN: Alexander Fleming went away on holiday, leaving some agar plates exposed on a lab bench near a windowsill. When he came back he noticed that there were small colonies of mold growing on his plates—and that around the colonies of mold were clear areas where the bacteria were not growing. Fleming realized that the mold must be the chemical that killed the bacteria, and so penicillin was discovered.

POST-IT MOTES: The idea for the Post-it note was conceived in 1974 by Arthur Fry as a way of holding his place in his hymnal while singing in the choir. He was aware of an adhesive accidentally developed in 1968 by fellow 3M employee Spencer Silver, who had tried to develop a super-strong adhesive. The company was skeptical about the product, but in 1980 it was introduced around the world to rousing success.



DID YOU KNOW? Walt Disney World in Florida is home to over 1.2 million pieces of theatrical clothing, making it the largest wardrobe in the world.

DANCE

If you have a sense of rhythm and a lot of energy, dance could be the perfect hobby for you. There are several different forms of dance, and options range from modern to hip-hop to ballet and partner dances.

Dancers often attend weekly classes, but no one says you can't dance alone. Find your inspiration, for example, from the internet, which is filled with unbelievable solo dance performances!



OID YOU KNOW? 119,986 people in Miami, Florida, set a world record for the longest conga dance line in 1988.
