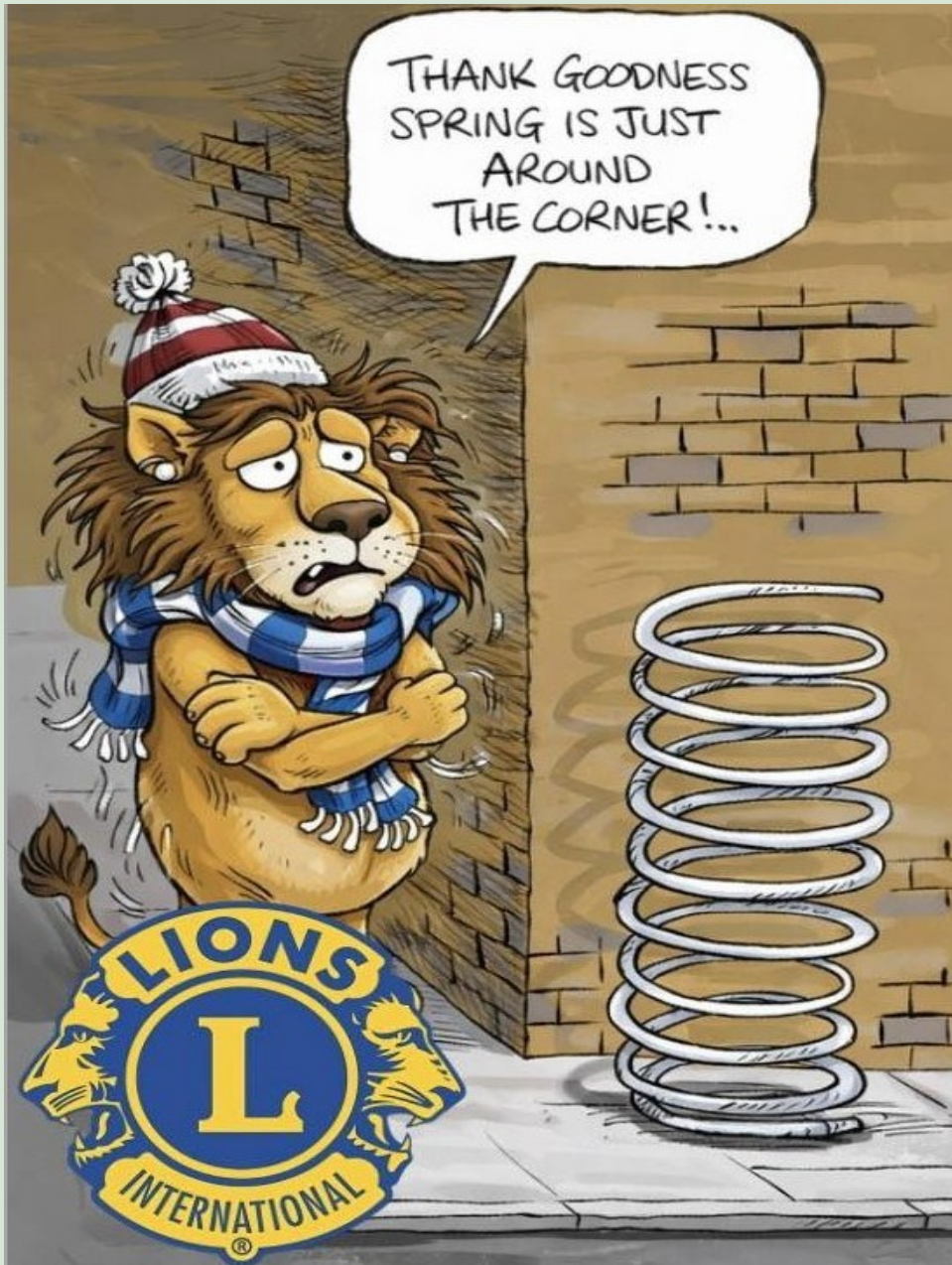

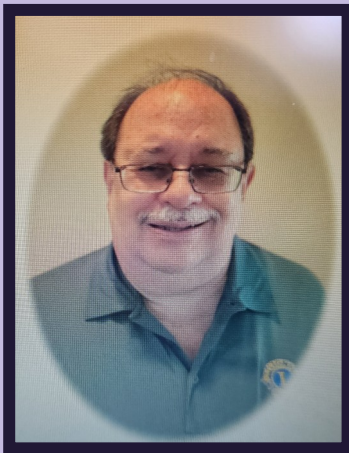


- **THAT DON AND I HAVE JOINED A BIRD-WATCHING CLUB!**

All Lions and Leos,

Teamwork in District 14-N

Every district in our state (multiple District 14), works together under a similar structure to accomplish our district goals. This structure is known as the Global Action Team structure. It has been established by Lions Club International to provide a common system of creating, planning and executing the goals of each district during a Lions Year in support of the international goals. The current set of goals that drive each district's goals is called Mission 1.5, which is the effort to expand the service Lions Club International provides to people across the globe each year. The goal is to have enough members to serve over one billion people each year around the world. Each district and team member is critical in the accomplishment of this goal, which is why Lions Club International holds each District Governor, and each member of the district Global Action Team, accountable for the accomplishment of these annual goals. What are these Global Action Team members and what are they responsible for?

The Global Action Team is like the baseball team. It is made up of several specific aspects of our district team. Each element of the Global Action Team is responsible for specific areas of action in our district and is mirrored by the positions in each club.

The Global Membership Team Coordinator is responsible for helping clubs across our district to add new members and retain members in our clubs to serve our communities.

The Club Membership Coordinator is the club level action person in this structure to help each club continue to grow by preparing plans to expand membership through recruiting and focusing on meaningful service, which keeps our members engaged and ready to serve. It is also incumbent upon these officers to help keep the Lions we have engaged in meaningful service in our communities. The old adage of "happy Lions, stay Lions" is still applicable today! Club membership Chairpersons can assess the health of our clubs by using the Club Health Assessment tool provided by LCI to gauge the satisfaction of club members and allow the club leadership to modify service to maximize satisfaction. Since retention in our clubs is, and has been, the most challenging leadership problem in our clubs, it is critical that all club leaders ask our membership chairpersons to conduct one of these surveys and take heed to the results.

The Global Service Team Coordinator is responsible for helping clubs identify meaningful service for their communities and then conduct visible projects in our communities. Further, they need to work together with club Second Vice Presidents, who are Service chairpersons, Secretary's and club administrators to help them report their service in the Lions Portal. If we don't report on our service in the portal, we won't know how much our clubs provide for our communities. Since the Club Excellence Award is now connected to clubs reporting service onto the portal, it is even more important for both our Lions and LEO clubs to report on their service in the portal.

The Global Leadership Team Coordinator is responsible for coordinating leadership training in our district and clubs. The team that the GLT Coordinator uses for accomplishing this training is the Zone Chairpersons in each county, along with the Region Chairpersons responsible for each county. As Zone Chairpersons, these Lions have been either a club Secretary or President and can assist clubs with a wide variety of tasks such as reporting service and managing membership in the Portal, conducting new member orientation training in clubs, assisting with conflict resolution issues in clubs, and providing a link to the resources available at the district level to help clubs be more successful in accomplishing their annual goals. When training sessions are conducted by Zone Chairpersons, this training must be reported to the district Global Leadership Team Coordinator so that the training can be entered into the Lions Portal and then reported so the clubs can get credit for completing the Officer and member training.

The Global Extension Team Coordinator is responsible for starting new clubs in the district. This can be a

traditional Lions Club, a Specialty Lions Club (focusing on a particular interest of the members), a Join Together Lions Club (combining interests of an established organization with the Global Causes of Lions Club International), a branch club while building toward chartering, or even an Alpha or Omega LEO Club. It entails using district demographics, areas of under or peripheral coverage by a Lions Club, and areas of opportunity to establish a new club within the district to provide more community members with the services that Lions can provide.

As you can see, this structure, provided by Lions Club International, provides the CEO of a district, the District Governor, with a responsive and accountable team of Lions responsible for the areas they willingly accept as volunteers to help make our districts stronger and healthier. Like every other organization, Lions Club International holds these volunteers responsible for the goals they develop and the accomplishment of these goals. Just as a baseball team relies on every team member, Lions Clubs relies on those who have "stepped up" to accomplish success. No other entity within a District, or a baseball team, is held accountable but those who are responsible.

Each member of the team is expected to work toward success for the team, be it baseball or Lions, to get to our goals. Currently, there are some members of our team who are not performing up to their potential. The District Governor, just like a good baseball club manager, has three options when someone is not performing as a member of the team. Call up someone from the bench to give the team a spark, trade for a well-known performer or simply call up someone from the minor leagues. We have numerous talented Lions in our clubs who would love the opportunity to serve on the district team. Some of those talented Lions have not been given then chance to demonstrate their abilities, since we have many club officers who keep them from moving forward. If you, as a Lion, feel you have talents that can be used by the Zones or district, but are being held back by current club officers, please reach out to the District Governor, who is the manager of the team, and voice your willingness to move forward. We need your energy, your ideas and your inspiration to move this team forward. Let's all be team players for Lions and focus on the service we can provide. Things don't always have to be the way they always were. "If you always do what you always did, you'll always get what you always got!" As the District governor, I'm inviting you to join the team and make our district "a winner!"

Midland Area Lions Club Celebrate Their Charter

17 January 2026

The Midland Area Lions Club was chartered on 20 October 2025 as the newest club in District 14-N. The club was chartered with 20 members initially and then two additional charter members were added. Lion Jeff Loudermilk was assigned by District Governor Brad Baillie as the Certified Guiding Lion to assist the club in developing into a strong and healthy club.



On 17 January 2026, the Midland Area Lions Club celebrated its Charter Night with a dinner at the St. Anthony Club in Midland. Our guest speaker for the event was Past International Director Cindy Gregg, who motivated the attendees with her wisdom and words of support for their decision to join the largest international service organization in the world. Lions from eight different clubs were in attendance to show their support for this new club. Among those were Little Beaver (the sponsoring Club), Beaver Falls, Butler, Chippewa, Riverside, Rostraver and Slippery Rock .



The celebration included a charter member induction ceremony for the new charter members (which included another new charter member, the Mayor of Midland, who joined that evening, bringing the total charter members to twenty-three), an officer installation ceremony, and a presentation of the gavel and bell to the Charter King Lion, Connie Drozdjibob. The meal was wonderful and the fellowship was even better!





The Midland Area Lions Club has started their mission of serving the communities of Midland, Georgetown, Glasgow, Hookstown, Industry, Ohioville and Shippingport with several meaningful projects. They participated in the "Trunk-or-Treat" event in Midland during October, then collected and donated five boxes of toys to the Community Center in Midland for distribution to children who would not otherwise have a Christmas. Many of it's members also participated in the Angel Tree project in Midland, answering the prayers of many of the community children in several of the local communities. One of our members also conducted a fantastic fund-raising event, with baskets, drawings and fifty-fifty tickets to help the Midland Community Library to keep it's door open for those in the surrounding communities. Several other service activities are being planned by members of the club, like an Easter Egg Brunch, a park path clean-up, and a community clean-up project. Two members participated in the District Food Packaging service project and took 648 meals back to the Community Center in Midland to be distributed to those in need.
